USDA Awards Loans and Grants to Support Rural Economic Development

Infrastructure investments will help create jobs, expand rural manufacturing

WASHINGTON, March 30, 2015 – Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack today announced the award of \$31 million in loans and grants for organizations in Iowa and 11 other states to promote rural economic development.

"These infrastructure investments will help rural residents start or expand businesses," Vilsack said. "The funds can be used for a wide range of needs. They can help businesses increase production and manufacturing capacity, and can even help rural homeowners save money by making their homes more energy efficient."

The funding is being provided thro ugh USDA's <u>Rural Economic Development Loan and Grant</u> (REDLG) program. Vilsack today announced \$31 million in loans and grants for 38 projects in 12 states, including nine projects in Iowa.

Through the REDLG program, USDA provides zero-interest loans and grants to utilities that lend funds to local businesses for projects to create and retain employment in rural areas. These revolving loan funds broaden the program's reach and create a multiplier effect for its impact. Eligible applicants are USDA <u>Rural Utilities Service</u> borrowers. Innovative USDA investments through this program are boosting economic development in rural communities all across the country, Vilsack noted.

Iowa proj ects receiving awards today include:

Midland Power Cooperative of Jefferson

• \$319,880 loan to construct a building that will be offered for sale to a prospective business in Iowa Falls

Heartland Power Cooperative of St. Ansgar

• \$1,000,000 loan to assist A to Z Drying, a manufacturing bu siness, buy machinery and equipment

Corn Belt Power Cooperative of Humboldt

- \$300,000 grant will be loaned to Iowa Falls Area Development Corp. to construct a shell building in an industrial park
- \$300,000 grant will be loaned to Kossuth Regional Health Center in Algona to renovate its radiology department

Grundy County Rural Electric Cooperative of Grundy Center

• \$2,000,000 loan to assist French Village, LLC build a licensed, assisted-living facility near Conrad.

Central Iowa Power Cooperative of Cedar Rapids

• \$2,000,000 loan to assist ELPLAST America Inc. build a 32,000-square-foot building in the Marion Industrial Park

Raccoon Valley Electric Cooperative of Glidden

• \$300,000 grant will be loaned to St. Anthony Regional Hospital and Nursing Home to renovate a building in Carroll.

Franklin Rural Electric Power Cooperative of Hampton

• \$300,000 grant will be loaned to Hampton Dental, PLC to acquire a dental practice in Hampton.

T.I.P. Rural Electric Cooperative of Brooklyn

• \$300,000 grant will be loaned to Grinnell Regional Medical Center for renovations

The awards announced today are contingent upon the recipients meeting the terms of the loan or grant agreement. View the <u>complete list of awards</u>.
